Recession in Germany, a looming trade war, the breakdown of decades-old alliances, coupled with a looming redivision of the world – the German economy is facing enormous challenges. Current international tensions and global uncertainty are greater than ever since the turn of the millennium. Added to this is the unresolved, ongoing man-made climate change, which is increasingly impacting the foundations of our lives and our economies.

Monetary and fiscal policy, as crucial aspects of government action, as well as corporate strategies, must adapt to the consequences of these global upheavals. At the 77th Monetary Workshop, we will address the specific challenges to transformation, growth, and security, including challenges to the transformation of the economy toward climate neutrality, as well as the security policy environment and potential growth opportunities.
